Behind the camera Marré seems to reveal parts of his daylight dreams full of vulnerable strong emotions, extraordinary affairs and romance. Sometimes his work is sexual. Always fragile yet strong at the same time. "I portray people as who they are. In my dream. Comfort is my key. Often I'm able to show an inner part that hasn't been exposed before."
