

I was pleasantly surprised while reading this book. Although it has been clearly designed to be used as a textbook, with end-of-chapter thought-provoking questions, it is invaluable for anyone involved in or even only interested in historic preservation. It succinctly explains methods to date an historic building, how to apply for historic certification and the correct ways to restore an historic edifice. I found especially interesting the chapters on the materials in the buildings; what they are made of, how they were made and how to date them in order to accurately determine the age of the building. The many pictures aptly illustrate the concepts explained in the book. The book is well laid out and readable. I have not received my book yet (I know? How can I review a book before I got it?) However, I was a student of the author, and we got to see it chapter by chapter while he was working on it. From a student's perspective it was a very helpful and informative book and not dull and dry like so many other textbooks out there that cover preservation law. It doesn't have the cynical wit of Thomas F. King, but it has great background information for students of historic architecture, design, or public history.
