Smashing! Simply smashing. I received an ARC of The Milliner's Secret in exchange for an honest review. It's difficult to review this book because I loved it so much and would enjoy discussing it, but I don't want to cause any spoilers. Let me say this though, this author has done her research, and she never patronizes the reader. Never over-explains. The details in this story are spot on and yet the story flows from its core: the romance that threads throughout the war years. This is indeed a story of a young woman's survival in one of the greatest tragedies of our time. Cora escaped London, in the pre-second world war era, after continued physical abuse from her father, and traveled to Paris with a stranger. There, with his help, she reinvented herself as a milliner. The story takes may twists and turns and the reader is left questioning who are Coralie's true friends and protectors. Who are her enemies? Withprotection from a high-ranking German lover her life becomes more complex with his sudden disappearance, reappearance, the friends she makes in

between. She struggles against the jealousies of competition in her industry, fights to protect her daughter, survives however she can against German invasion, assists those in need, and never forgets her German lover, or the fact that her Parisian life and identity is built upon lies. This is Ms. Evan's second novel, the first, The Dress Thief, is a stand alone but does have a couple of returning characters in The Milliner's Secret. They can easily be read out of order. I look forward to more from this wonderful author.

The Millinerâ Â™s Secret is a follow on to The Dress Thief, set in pre-war Paris but can absolutely be read as a stand alone. Cora is a Bermondsey girl through and through, with a dad who, at the drop of a hat (no pun intended) would beat seven bells out of her (in other words, thrash her to within an inch of her life). She works in a lowly position at milliners Pettrew and Lofthouse. Through her work she wins a ticket to attend Epsom Downs Races and duly takes her friend Donal. A bit of betting and socialising make it an enjoyable day out until she meets Dietrich in the company of Ottilia, and somehow there is a spark. Before long she is at the station fulfilling a long held dream of travelling to Paris, now with him, with no prospect of a job other than the patronage of the rather handsome German man. Cora does not A¢A Aœwait for life to unfoldâ Â|she rides after it, like a gaucho roping a steerâ Âœ. And that is certainly how the spirited heroine negotiates her way in the new city as war unfurls. However, she soon finds herself on the verge of destitution because Dietrich has disappeared and she needs to work fast to keep her head above water. She thus assumes the persona of Coralie de Lirac â Â" of course, she has knowledge of French through her Belgian father. Various encounters later she is running her own hat shop whilst war is escalating and soon she is in a new relationship with Ramon Cazaubon. Pregnancy ensues to complicate her life and little No $\tilde{A}f\hat{A}$ «lie arrives. As she actively engages in the Resistance during the war years, whilst keeping her hat business afloat, Coralie is definitely â Âœa working class girl who dares to reach for the starsâ Âœ! Wheels within wheels, people of all nationalities populate the storyline and those who have disappeared soon reappear. But who can Coralie trust?Paris remains unscathed in the early years but the inevitable hardships of the time descend. The Germans take up residence in The Crillon at the heart of the city; and is that a Swastika atop the Eiffel Tower? It is clear that Natalie has done a lot of research and has taken a great deal of care to set the developing storyline against a backdrop of monumental unfolding history. This story starts as a domestic struggle and enters worlds of vogue, intrigue, betrayal, love, tragedy and hope. As frustrated as I got with Coralie's decisions waivering among bravery, weakness, and selfishness, I realized that of course it had to be that way. If she was always steadfast and resolute or even lucky, then it just wouldn't be believable. There would be no connection, yet the author shows you so much a part of the character's soul that you see her as a person and not as a story. I loved the analogy of the onion that the author highlights in the book because you get to see a different side of WWII than I think typically gets portrayed. Those stuck between unwillingness and necessary collaboration with an evil world must have been depths of despair I could not imagine.Do not expect this to be a quick, light read. It definitely took some time to get through because there are so many avenues of plot woven together, so very thoroughly connected but certainly worth it. I think I was most kept off-guard by Dietrich and appreciate him the most even if I liked other characters better. Bravo!
